

The Michigan State Women's Bowling Association tournament honoree for 2018 is Libbi Fletcher.


In the 40 plus years that Libbi has been a member of what is now the Metro Detroit USBC, 25 were as an Officer or Director - first as a Director for 15 years, and from 3rd Vice-President to President in the next five years (a position she held for four years). Because of term limits, Libbi was unable to seek re-election as President, but she is once again serving as a Director on the Metro Detroit USBC Board.

She served on the WIBC Board of Directors from 2002 until 2006 with various committee assignments. In 2007 she was appointed to the USBC Board of Directors, was re-elected in 2009 and served as chair of the Strategic Planning Committee and the Diversity Committee. Libbi also continues to serve on the BVL (Brightening Veterans Lives) committee and her enthusiasm for this wonderful charity is enough to make us all want to donate more!

The Michigan Women honor Libbi especially for her contribution to the state tournament. For 25 plus years, Libbi has been recognized as a Michigan State WBA State Tournament Squad Leader by bringing in 10 or more teams to bowl in the State Tournament. In 2017 Libbi brought in 29 teams. For the 2018 tournament she has signed up 32 teams. She also was a member of the Tellers Committee for three years, served as its chair for one year and was an Assistant Sergeant at Arms for one year. She has bowled in 30 consecutive city, state and national tournaments.

Libbi was inducted into the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame for Meritorious Service in 2008 and that same year was a recipient of the John P. Gavie Award, an award that promotes the sport of bowling. She was also honored as the 2005 Woman of the Year by the DWBA. In 2011 she was inducted in to the Michigan State Women's Bowling Hall of Fame, for her service to bowling. At the January Delegates meeting, Libbi was also elected to the new (combined) state board and will begin serving her term in August.

Congratulations Libbi a well deserved honor.







Delegates Reception - highlights

The Michigan State Women's Bowling association is proud to announce for our final meeting in June, at the Bavarian Inn in Frankenmuth, we will be hosting the group sponsored by BVL, "Re-Creation"

From the BVL website, we share their story:



RE-CREATION ..BEGAN IN 1976.....when Hugh Brooks, the founder of the group, was an instructor at the Pennsylvania State University. While visiting practicum students, he realized that very few institutions have opportunity to benefit from the therapeutic value of live professional entertainment. Concerned, he organized Re-Creation to offer this service to state centers, prisons, hospitals, nursing homes, and other care facilities. Entertainers were enlisted, and Re-Creation immediately began institutional performances in Pennsylvania. Within a very short time Re-Creation was asked to tour for the USO, and Veterans Affairs Medical Centers were added to the schedule.

Re-Creation assumed full responsibility for the national VA program in 1983.

Re-Creation now presents more than 320 shows a year. Half of those shows are staged at fairs, banquets, conventions, schools, churches... which in turn fund the other half...more than 150 shows annually in VA Medical Centers and State Veterans Homes in all 50 states!

The young people in Re-Creation are not paid for their service. They give up at least a year of their lives to travel the country entertaining the men and women in our VA Medical Centers. Arriving at the VA facilities four hours before showtime...

They set up...change into costumes...and visit hospital rooms and wards. Then they assist patients to the show area, perform for them, return them to their rooms, pack up and load equipment, and drive on, averaging 300 miles a day...

The wonderful "Re-Creation" performers are literally BVL's arms and legs in the field," explains BVL Executive Director Mary Harrar. "They touch the hearts of our veterans and let them know we haven't forgotten their sacrifices."

For more than 40 years, "Re-Creation" has been touring the United States providing delights for so many veterans confined to a hospital or living in a State Home.

Here are just a few stories from some of their tours:

"This is my second time seeing your show and it is just so wholesome. It's full of patriotism, full of LOVE. The upbeat positivity and the patriotism pull on the heartstrings and are so important for the veterans. They're not sitting in a 4×4 room looking at a white wall for the afternoon. You bring so much happiness, love, and joy to these places, you break their (the veterans) routine."

Volunteer at the Bedford, MA, VAMC

"Thank you for coming. I've had a rough week. The things that put me in here were starting to come back and I was pretty down. But look (pointing to his beaming face) I smiled the whole show! Really appreciate you guys! Thank you."

Veteran, age 30, Leavenworth, KS VAMC

"Today was my 16th year observing the Re-Creation tour. Our veterans, as every year, have been moved to tears, clapping, and stomping their feet while they enjoyed the performance. It was really an exceptional tour! The music, as music does, stirs something within the soul. It brings such an enthusiasm to our campus, our veterans are moved in ways that we don't often see them moved because of the patriotic songs; the performances really speak to their soul. It's heartwarming to watch our veterans respond in a way that maybe

we can't have them respond through our normal recreation programming, or through our various activities we have throughout the year."

Administrator, Warrensburg, MO SVH

Harrar continues, "Unfortunately, "Re-Creation" lost some of their other funding sources last year and while we've increased our subsidy to the program, we also need to maintain our commitments to the local VAs for their recreational therapy programs. We're asking for all our supporters to consider making a special additional donation to BVL in 2018, and earmark it for 'Re-Creation' - we want to be sure to keep this good thing going!

Final Frame

Lavolia Brown who was inducted in the Michigan State Hall of Fame (Star of Yesterday) in 1993, passed away a few weeks ago.

This is from her induction:

"Although Lavolia is being recognized as a Star of Yesteryear, she is still active, bowling in the Royalettes Classic League and carrying an average of 176

High averages for ladies were rare when Lavolia carried a 196 during the 1971-72 season. The same year, she rolled a high series of 723. Her highest game was 290 in 1974-75. She also had a 289 during the 1960-61 season.

Her first State title was won in 1966. With her partner, Mary Kilgore, they won the Doubles with 1226. She was a member of the Motown Records Team when they won the Championship in 1971, 1972 and again in 1978 with a high score of 3147. On a roll, she won the doubles, again with Mary Kilgore, in 1978 with a score of 1242.



Locally, Lavolia was All Events Champion in 1972 with a score of 1778 and on the Champion Motown Team in 1977 and 1979. She was named to the No. 2 All City Team in 1973-74 and to the No. 1 Team in 1974-75.

When she retired from her job, she devoted much of her time doing volunteer work at her church."

Our sincere sympathy to family and friends in her passing, knowing her legacy will live on in those that loved her.



Michigan State Hall of Fame

Martha (Martie) Boron began her bowling journey back in her home state of Maryland. She started bowling duckpins as a kid. When she went off to college at the University of Maryland she was introduced to the game of ten pins. In college Martie and her future husband Jerry joined a mixed league for fun. Following graduation Martie worked as a physical education teacher while she waited for Jerry to graduate through the G.I. Bill. After marrying and moving to Michigan Martie would go on to complete her Masters in Guidance and Counseling at the University of Michigan. In the early 70's, someone would ask Martie to attend a meeting that would change her life.

Martie attended an annual meeting for the Tri-City Women's Bowling Association and was immediately hooked by the administrative side of bowling. In 1974, she was appointed to the Tri-City WBA Board of Directors. Martie would go on to hold every position on the local board except the secretary. Her tenure included 11 years as the association president. When the Tri-City WBA and the Western Wayne County Bowling Association merged Martie would go forward on the new board and except for a brief



hiatus is still active on the Western Wayne County USBC Board today. Among her proudest accomplishments on her local board is the work they did on their BVL Tournament during the late 70's and early 80's. The association would also hold 50/50 collections for the BVL fundraising effort. For her efforts on behalf of her local association she was elected to their Hall of Fame in 1993.

During this time Martie would sadly lose her husband and rejoin the workforce. Her first job would be at Oak Lanes in Westland where she worked the counter and coached the youth. After a couple more jobs Martie would land a position with the University of Michigan in 1985. In 2008, she would retire as the Assistant Director of the Ph.D. program at the business school at Michigan.

In 1996, Martie was elected as a director on the Michigan State Women's Bowling Association. She has represented the area which includes Western Wayne County, Arbor Valley, Monroe, and Lenawee to this day. In January, she was elected to represent the same area on the new merged state board. During her tenure on the state board she has been a member of the legislative, delegate reception and luncheon, and awards banquet committees. Martie was the chair of the tournament rules committee. She has also been the Acting Sergeant at Arms during the annual meeting. On the state level Martie is most proud of the service and professionalism the association offers its members. On the national level Martie had served on the teller committee during the WIBC days.







Rose has been honored numerous times for her outstanding and tireless contributions to the game of bowling. She was inducted into the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame as well as the Michigan Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame. Rose was also honored with the Judge John D. Watts

Award "Woman of the Year" by the Bowling Proprietor's Association and "Secretary of the Year" by the Michigan Women's Bowling Association to name a few.

Doug Arden



The hosting centers are Fairlanes in Grandville for the team event and Westgate Bowl in Comstock Park for the doubles/singles portion. We look forward to their west side hospitality. Entries were given to associations that attended the workshop in Lansing in August. Those not in attendance had their entries mailed to them. If you have not received yours yet please, contact your local association. State entry forms can also be found on our website at **MichiganStateUSBC.com** under the "forms" tab and are fill-able and can be saved.

Things to remember about the Youth State Tournament:

- If you have reserved dates the deadline is January 9th and all others are due January 23rd. If you miss your deadline there is an additional cost of \$5 per person and will be accepted on a space available basis.
- You may use a credit card but must provide an email address. You will be contacted directly by the billing agency the office never sees your card number. There is a 3% service charge fee.
- This event uses the 10 pin rule pertaining to average. Please read rule 3b to make sure all averages are submitted correctly. This is the rule that causes delay in final standings.
- · Please read all of the rules especially those in red.
- · Remember to thank the local association members that will be on site helping to make the event a success.

Pepsi State Finals will be held in the Detroit Area this year with Bow I One in Troy having the younger bow lers and Sterling Lanes in Sterling Heights hosting the older bow lers. These were included in the pack with all the other entries but you will not find them on the website. This is because for this event you MUST qualify for through a league. Only those that qualified through their league will be entered in this event. If you aren't sure how this works please contact the office and we will help you. On the website you will find the Pepsi Report Form that MUST be submitted with entries.

Things to remember about the Pepsi State Finals:

ALL bow lers must qualify through a USBC League.

- There is a new division this season U17 has been added to Pepsi and to Junior Gold.
- The Pepsi Report Form must be submitted with entries and payment. This allows us to balance the money sent

in but more importantly the reverse side of the form is where alternates are listed.

- There is no substitution allowed in this event only alternates. This is why the Report Form is so important. If a bow lers name is not listed as an alternate they are not eligible to bow I. All alternates must come from the same division that the original bow ler qualified through. i.e. U17 Girls in 'XYZ" League from "Home" Lanes.
- If you were granted early qualifying your deadline is January 5th. Regular qualifying deadline is February 13th. Due to USBC rule 310a any entries received after that will be returned.
- · We have only 2 weekends for this event due to changes made by USBC in regards to Junior Gold. We hope all that qualify are able to attend one of those 4 days to bow I.
- Junior Gold National Finals are being held in the Detroit area this season. This is a huge event and Metro Detroit USBC will be needing volunteers to work. Please contact their office if you have the time to spend and want to see some fabulous youth bow lers!

Please get your entries filled out and submitted to give your kids the chance to participate in these events. The memories will be special for all and don't forget about all the scholarship opportunities that are involved for the kids. We look forward to seeing all of you at one or both of these event

From the State office

RVP/Safesport Training

First, thank you to everyone who has already taken the steps to do the training. We are aware that USBC is starting the process of emailing/contacting those individuals who have not already done so.

We also have been in contact with USBC as to what will happen to those board members, local and state, who do not do the training and become RVP's. Here is what we have been told – First this is something that is coming from the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) and it is being mandated by them. Moving forward this will become an eligibility issue and members will be deemed ineligible to serve on the board.

Some of you are on local boards that do not have youth programs.....

First, whether or not you have a youth program in your area - You are still REQUIRED to have 20% of your board represented by youth directors. This is a requirement of charter. You should be moving to develop youth programs

in your area. So again, you still have to have 20% of your board from the youth. You can't get around this and it is being checked by USBC.

Second, because of these new requirements (see below), EVERY board member does need to be an RVP and in order to do so, MUST complete the training prior to being allowed to apply through NCSI.

While we realize this may not be what you want to hear or that you are receiving resistance from your local board members – YOU can't get around it, WE all must do the training and apply for RVP status. If they want to serve on your board, they must comply.

For those board members who do not have access to a computer (the training is about 2+ hours – there are 4 parts), try to secure a laptop for their use – try to schedule time blocks for this purpose. All associations need to help board members get this done. So please, try to assist them in getting this done and meeting the deadline. This is not just a USBC requirement, it is an USOC requirement and as part of the USOC, it has been mandated by USBC.

Again, our thanks to each of you for your cooperation in getting this done and being compliant and for your efforts in making sure everyone on your local boards do the same.

Section M. Other Requirements

1. Registered Volunteer Program

The United States Bow ling Congress' Registered Volunteer Program was created in 2006 to protect the youth who participate in USBC Youth programs. Providing a safe environment for youth bowlers is USBC's highest priority.

The USBC Registered Volunteer Program accomplishes two very important goals:

Everyone deserves to participate in sports free from bullying, hazing, sexual misconduct or any form of emotional or physical abuse. USBC's Registered Volunteer Program is designed to ensure all w ho w ork w ith youth members are dedicated to that objective.

RVP approval is now required of every state and local board member, every youth

committee member and youth director, plus all USBC Youth tournament managers. Each person is required to complete the training process by Jan. 1, 2019. USBC will send notification to those required to hold RVP approval with information on how to properly register for the training.

It requires all volunteers who have regular contact with USBC youth bowlers to have gone through a mandatory criminal background screening designed to remove and/or discourage those who might harmour kids.

It **now** includes a training component, through SafeSport.org, so those who work closely with youth members can recognize if an athlete is being abused, learn how to prevent abuse and how to respond, if abuse has happened.

Anyone 18 years of age or older who has regular contact or authority over USBC Youth members and those individuals within USBC governance structure are required to complete the SafeSport training and possess their RVP certification. Specific roles or positions within USBC require compliance. Those roles are:

1. USBC National

- Headquarters employees
- o Officers and Directors
- Youth Committee members
- o Team USA members

- Junior Team USA members
- 2. State and Local Associations
- Officers and Directors
- Association Managers
- o Youth Committee members
- 3. USBC Youth league officers
- 4. USBC Youth tournament managers
- 5. USBC Certified Coaches

Anyone w ho **currently holds** RVP certification will need to complete the required online SafeSport training by Jan. 1, 2019. There is no cost for the online training and it can be accessed 24 hours a day. USBC members and USBC-certified coaches should go through **BOWL.com/RVP** to access the SafeSport training and to provide their USBC national ID when registering for training.

Association Policy Manual

Revised 11-17-18 -36

For anyone **seeking to complete** the RVP process, they first must complete the SafeSport education. Once USBC receives notification a person has completed SafeSport training, it will direct the applicant to complete the background screening portion through the National Center for Safety Initiatives (NCSI).

The NCSI background check process also is done online, and NCSI does charge a fee of \$21.25 to cover its costs to perform the required checks. The fee might be higher in states that require additional fees to access its data.

Hall of Fame-Lansing

Kirt Gundry

He is being inducted into the Lansing Bowling Hall of Fame in the Accomplishment category for his achievements in the sport. After learning the game from some of Lansing's finest bowlers, Kirt actively participated in numerous leagues and competitions. A job at Pro Bowl led to learning how to drill bowling balls by working for Chuck Morden at Chuck's Pro Shop and then to Mason Lanes as assistant manager and pro shop operator. Kirt was elected to the Lansing USBC Board of Directors in 2017.



Kirt's greatest bowling memory is shooting 242-236-299-777 in singles at the 1999 ABC National Championships in Syracuse, NY. He left a 4-pin on the last shot of the tournament. Winning the Michigan State Tournament singles title in 2012 with 248-236-290/774 on one of the hardest conditions he ever bowled on was exciting too. Kirt plans to participate in a least 50 national championships – he has bowled in 39 consecutive tournaments so far.



Tracey J. Distel

She is being inducted into the Lansing Bowling Hall of Fame in the Accomplishment category for her achievements in the sport. She bowled in junior leagues in Italy and Oscoda and collegiality with Michigan State University. Tracey was the first recipient of the Bea Lane Leadership Scholarship which includes **achievement** in **activities** other than bowling. Her first adult singles event win was in the Lansing City tournament at Lansing Recreation. Tracey shot her first 300 on her

dad's birthday, 11/5/98 at Pro Bowl East. Her highest series of 795 was shot at Notkke's Bowl in the Women's State Tournament. Tracey was a member of the Holiday Lanes team that was the first women's team to bowl in the Joe Joseph Capital City Classic. She served on Track staff for 3

years as an amateur. Tracey has served as league President and Secretary. She is currently the Tournament Manager of the Lansing Women's City Tournament.

Hall of Fame- Muskegon

Dave has held membership in Muskegon associations for over 55 years, rolling over 5,000 sanctioned games. His high average a 212, and he rolled a 300 game in 1994. Dave continues to bowl in 3 leagues to this day and very seldom misses.

The Michigan State Open tournament begins its 116th annual run on January 12, 2019.

This year's tournament is dedicated to Mark Martin from Metro

Detroit.

Mark served on the Michigan State Board from 1998 thru July 2018. During that time he chaired the Masters Committee, since its inception in 2008, and the Hall of Fame Committee since 2010. Also on his state resume is Director of the Year award in 2003. On the national level, he served on the ABC (American Bowling Congress) board from 2002 until 2005 and currently is on the USBC (United State Bowling Congress) board since 2010. He is the USBC Legal and Legislative Committee Chair and also serves on several other USBC Committees.



Locally he joined the Greater Detroit Bowling Association Board in 1986 and served on the board until 2006. In 1996 he was selected Executive Director of the GDBA and subsequently, as Association Manager of the Metro Detroit USBC, a position he holds to this day. In 2003, the Detroit Women's Bowling Association hired him as their association Secretary/Treasurer, the first male to hold the position in WIBC.

He was elected into the Greater Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame in 2003, received the Michigan State Bowling Council Journalist Award in 1997, a BWAA writing award in 2010, the Thomas McKay award for lifetime achievement in 2011 and the Michigan State USBC WBA Manager of the Year in 2011. He believes that promotion of our sport is key to bowling being healthy. In that view, he was co-founder and executive producer of the Greater Detroit Bowling Bonanza television program from 2002-2004, host of the Michigan Kingpins in 2013-2014, and currently producer and host of Bowling Showcase. As a bowler for over 50 years, he has participated in the ABC/USBC Open Championships continuously since 1979 with a career tournament average of 183. He also has participated in the Michigan State and Detroit Association tournaments for over 25 years.

He has three career 300 games, a high series of 782 and a high average of 221
