Matthew Sterbenz



Tournament which took place in Port Huron, Michigan back in 1956.


I tried to find some additional information about the tournament and couldn't get any of the bowling details on how the gals did in the tournament and there were no articles in the 'limited amount of Tekonsha newspapers that the historical society has for 1956. But upon talking to Sharron about her memories of how bowling was part of her childhood, as both of her parents were on bowling leagues, it is my understanding that bowling was a big part of many families here in Tekonsha. Both her mom and dad (Ken Patten) played on leagues that were scheduled at different times so it helped with family care. For many years throughout the 1960's and beyond, there were weekly standings from the area bowling leagues and the scores from the participating bowlers that were printed in the IDEA paper. Even today, there are still leagues and participating area residents that still enjoy the sport of bowling.
