I started bowling in 1973 when I came back from college. I bowled in college with friends for fun, but softball was my favorite sport at the time. I had not thought seriously about bowling until I went by Metro Bowl to see some friends who were bowling. I found the game of bowling exciting and decided that I wanted to try it. I remember my first bowling ball was a green metallic like ball. Yes, it only weighed 10 pounds that I bought at K-Mart, shoes and all. Now I was

Rick was born in Lansing in 1955. His interest in bowling began in the late 60's, his profits from his paper route financed his practice and pot game matches at Cedarway Lanes. He was employed by Cedarway Lanes on a high school co-op program at \$2.00 per hour. Rick bowled in his first ABC national tournament in 1973 and has now bowled 51 consecutive tournaments and has averaged 191. He started competing in the Capitol City Classic league during

> Rick bowled on the first team to break 3700 in the state of Michigan in 1987 with a score of 3709 which was the 2nd highest team score in the country that year and at the time was the 14th highest team score ever bowled. He may have been the only Lansing bowler to have bowled on teams that exceeded 3700 twice. On October 26, 2005, his Indian Hills team, Ray Kemmer, J. C. Petersen, Gary Stoneham, and Rick Patzkowsky bowled a 3777 that was a city record at the time.

the late 80's who provided some bowling instructions and continued to bowl for recreation. She bowled in various leagues at Metro Bowl - Metro Women, Scot – Royal Scot Peterson Point, and at Pro Bowl West MI Dept of Public Health.

In 1991 Valerie won the Lansing 600 Tournament **Division A Handicap** Doubles with Velma Watson with a score of 1482 + 244 = 1726. In 1995 Valerie also won the Lansing 600 Tournament Division A Actual & Handicap Singles with a score of 928 + 76 = 1006, Actual and Handicap All Events 1650 +152 = 1004.

Valerie continued bowling on numerous leagues always improving her average from 168-174 in the 80's to 175-198 in the 90's. From 2000 to present Valerie has averaged in the 200's with her highest average of 217 in 2010-2011 season where she earned a spot on the Lansing All City Team. Since then, she has been a member of the Lansing Senior All City Team in 2015 - 2020, 2022 and 2023 and
